INTRODUCTION

The meeting took off by a word of prayer at 10.30am from Abdullahi sheikh. The chairman Mr. Gufu Guyo said that the meeting was supposed to be done at the end of the year but due to an avoidable circumstance we had to push it to this day. He said schools were opened in January and also management team was also busy with Dr Pino and other visitors for planning meetings. He further explained that

The secretary Mr. Abdub read out minutes of previous meetings

MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

Mr. Abdub read out the minutes and members agreed it was a true deliberation of previous meeting

Mr. Shama Alio wanted to know whether one of the two beneficiaries Mrs. Qabale Wario had completed her part to finish the house built by CIPAD. The chairman responded that, both families have completed their work and now live in those houses and they were given two donkeys each for income generating. He said that he mobilized village elders and committees to make work done. He said a good relationship of a beneficiary with his villagers is very crucial as seen with Hadija Abduba of milimani village unlike Qabale Wario of Buqele village on part of community participation.

He narrated to members that Mrs. Hadija is now selling water, she sales about 300/= per day, she explained that this has improved her relationship with her villagers.

Mr. Gufu Duba explained to members that the donkey programme was as a result of some donor's fetched water using donkeys at Obbitu, photos taken and funds raised to purchase seven donkeys for sustainability of programme.

Pastor Wario added that this was a good idea and someone must graduate after given the donkeys as an exit strategy.

The chairman Mr. Gufu Guyo informed members that certificate for Obbitu is with us dated 18/12/2012 and will expire on 15/12/2015.

Court order was not possible due to this certificate but now the process can now continue. The members were happy and thanked the management team for their effort and took round the certificate to look at it.

MINUTE1/2/2014 OVC/OBBITU VILLAGE UPDATES

The village supervisor Mr. Abdub explained to members

1) HEALTH

He said that all children are healthy and are doing well they have grown in height and size; three children at Obbitu Jarso, Fugich and Halima are asthmatic cases, Darmi and Buke had brucellosis and is recurring.

Health assessment by PFL has been going on and minor cases cared for. Two cases were referred one to Kenyatta national hospital Qalich Tadicha who died and Bahati Salad who was referred to meru hospital and treated .Eight children were referred to Sololo hospital and catered for during previous month.

2) CLOTHING

Children at Obbitu had enough clothes. School uniforms, bags and shoes.HBC children were also given some clothes brought by donors from Mondeco and rubber shoes donated by APHIAPLUS

3) EDUCATION

Mr. Abdub continued to explain that out of 23 children in Obbitu village 2 of them attend Tumaini nursery7 of them attend Gadha Academy and 11 of them at Starehe Academy We have no children in class one and others are in class two to class six

3) FOOD

Mr. Abdub explained that children at Obbitu eat enough food. They eat varieties of quality food fruits and vegetables. Children opinion is consulted when planning for meals, children from Starehe have improved in weight since they started coming back for lunch at Obbitu

The chairman commented that the project discourage repetition and drop out instead help we help our beneficiaries to join polytechnic and apprenticeship so that they can be self reliant He mentioned of paying school fees for 27 OVC and one university student 28,000/= who is not in programme but our beneficiary

Mr. Mathew Galgallo who is an education officer commented that there is need for the organization to work with education office to stop repetition of 62 children and drop out in various schools. He went on and encouraged the project coordinator to have say at education forums as an important stake holder

Poor performance in Sololo district was discussed at length

Mrs. Badane Golicha suggested tuition for sponsored children but members did not agree with her idea.

MINUTE3/2/2014 GREEN HOUSE PROJECT

The chairman Mr. Gufu Guyo updated members on the progress made at farming unit He went on and said school agriculture clubs of Obbu Girls and Sololo boy's secondary schools will benefit. Promotion of Moringa tree will be done and each beneficiary will be given one Moringa tree to plant in there homestead to boost nutrition and other benefits from the plant.

MINUTE4/2/2014 NHIF PROJECT

The chairman informed members that NHIF project by CCM has phased out .The 320/= budgeted for 200 beneficiaries was not spent as intended .Only 160/= for out patient was paid during project lifespan due to some issues at NHIF headquarters. The balance of 320,000/=has been transferred to NHIF from December to September 2014.He said our children will continue benefiting if they have birth certificates for inpatient and CIPAD shall pay for referrals for out patient as before

MINUTE5/2/2014 APHIAPLUS PROJECT UPDATES

Mr. Gufu Guyo explained to members that APHIA PLUS has approved a budget of 1.4 million in a proposal for CIPAD this year. He said in the proposal are 2 shelter renovetions, 6 donkeys for sustainability,85 school uniforms,2 sewing machines and bee keeping for Obbitu.

MINUTE6/2/2014 AUDIT REPORT

The chairman informed members that CIPAD was audited last year for the year 2012 and 2013 He shared with members the approved report and went perused through.

MINUTE 7/2/2014 FINANCIAL REPORT

Mr. Abdub read out to members' summary financial report for the months of October, November and December 2013

The expenditures were explained to members where they needed clarifications

MINUTE8/2/2014 WAY FORWARD

The chairman narrated to members that Dr Pino has expressed difficulties in raising funds due to economic crisis in Europe and competition by giant organizations. He feared this might slow down growth of project CIPAD will concentrate only on Obbitu village and reduce funds for HBC

Members discussed on project sustainability be fore the project accomplish its goal and they lamented on discouraging environment

Some suggested the green house and bee keeping as promising

Mr. Gufu hinted to members that the donor might start one more family three house

Mr. Mathew suggested for community sensitization and local strategy to raise funds for the project

Since there were no other business to be discussed the meeting was closed by a word of prayer from pastor Wario
